PATIENT **OBSERVATIONS**

Caesar Staab
Prostate: Submitted are 3 excellent videos of excellent collections of cells from the prostate in Caesar. The cellularity is quite prominent with large numbers of epithelial cells scattered throughout. In many locations, these epithelial cells are packeted. Many of them are individualized, demonstrating prominent anisocytosis and anisokaryosis. There are scattered inflammatory cells including neutrophils throughout the smears. Degenerate cells and macrophages with foamy cytoplasm are identified. The epithelial cells have slight vacuolization.

SPECIES **INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**
Canine Prostate - Carcinoma consistent with urothelial carcinoma.

BREED **COMMENTS**

Yorkie
The most common carcinoma in the prostate in the dog is the urothelial cell carcinoma. Prosthetic carcinomas occur but they are rare in the dog. This cellularity is most consistent with a urothelial cell carcinoma in my opinion. The growth appears to be fairly aggressive. Therapy may prolong Caesar's life but an unfavorable prognosis is expected in my opinion.

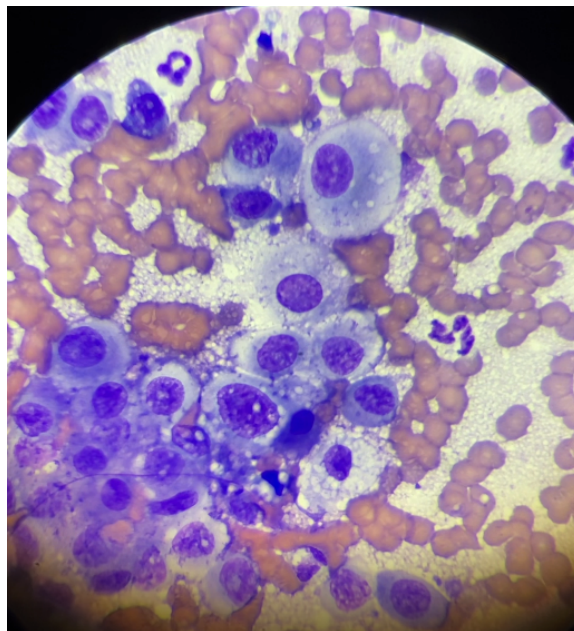
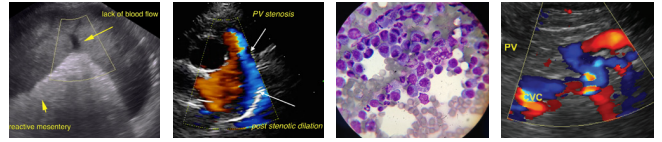


Image shows neoplastic cells collected from the prostate in Caesar. There is prominent anisocytosis and anisokaryosis.
