PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

History: 4 day hx of not eating and lethargy - 6 lbs weight loss (he is overweight BCS 7/9)

SPECIES

Canine

ULTRASONOGRAPHIC EXAMINATION OF THE ABDOMEN

Spleen

The **spleen** is enlarged with hypoechoic, irregular contour with multi-focal, coalescing nodular changes. The spleen was folded upon itself with enhanced surrounding mesentery. This is strongly suggestive for a round cell neoplastic pattern.

BREED

Bernese Mountain Dog

SEX

Neutered male

ULTRASONOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Enlarged, hypoechoic spleen with coalescing nodular changes.

AGE

8 years

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Full FNA of the spleen is recommended along with full abdominal sonogram to assess for associated pathology especially involving the spleen and lymph nodes. Chest radiographs are warranted to assess for metastatic disease.
