PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

History: 8 year old spayed Female Golden Retriever. 2 day history of vomiting and not eating. abdominal palpitation enlarged spleen found. Abdominal radiograph=Splenomegaly. Ordered AUS for evaluation. Other PE Findings=NSF

ULTRASONOGRAPHIC EXAMINATION OF THE ABDOMEN

BREED

Golden

Spleen

The **spleen** presented multiple, hypoechoic, expansive, nodular masses and coalescing target lesions with capsular expansion.

SEX

Female

The mesenteric lymph node was enlarged. Reactive mesentery was noted associated with the small intestine.

AGE

8 years

ULTRASONOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Splenic masses and nodular changes. Consistent with target lesions.

WEIGHT

72.8 lbs

Regional mesenteric lymphadenopathy.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Full abdominal sonogram is warranted. Multi-centric round cell neoplasia is suspected.
