 Radiographs: Diaphragm is not clear in this patient. Liver appeared to be present on radiographs.

A 4.2 cm parenchymal mass was noted in the chest deviating the heart. There were mild areas of free fluid and regional inflammation. The heart was deviated significantly. Trace amounts of free fluid were noted.

ULTRASONOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Thoracic mass with cardiac deviation, round cell neoplasia, complicated hepatic hernia is technically possible. I cannot rule out herniation of the liver with strangulation.


WEIGHT


