Skylar Praymayer History: sudden onset of diarrhea and vomiting

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Parvo -ve and the rest of blood work including cpli is normal

**SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN**

Canine The body condition score is 5/9. Skeletal immaturity compatible with the given age is noted, as well as an age related reduced serosal detail in the abdominal cavity.

**BREED** The surrounding structures are within normal limits.

Terrier Yorkshire Mix Diaphragm and abdominal wall are intact.

**SEX** The liver is located within the costal arch and the caudo-ventral lobe is pointed.

Female The head of the spleen appears physiological.

**AGE** The stomach contains a moderate amount of unformed food with mineral opacities in the pyloric region; the small intestinal loops occupy the central abdomen, appear of homogeneous and contain mineral material throughout. Colon and rectum contain a moderate amount of fluid and gas.

11 Weeks The other structures are not readily assessable.

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

**HOSPITAL NAME** The mineral opacities in the small intestine could be the cause for the clinical signs and may have been eaten by accident. They could also be the result of feeling unwell and imbibing non-food material; alternatively, they could be located in the food itself. Diarrhea and vomiting can be caused by a variety of viruses and supportive treatment is indicated. Hypermotility can cause intussusceptions, sometimes sliding, and the dog should thus be monitored closely.
