SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE HEAD

Canine Both tympanic bullae have a similar opacity, and the structures of the neck muscles can be seen through them. The bony walls are smooth and thin. Both horizontal ear canals contain air and its end is overlying the lateral bulla walls. On the right some wall calcification is present.

- Calcification of horizontal ear canal walls

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Assessment of bulla contents is best done with CT because small amounts of fluid and mucosal thickening are not appreciated radiographically. I can, however, see no gross abnormalities. The calcification of the auricular cartilages suggests inflammation of the external ear canal as seen with otitis externa.
