


PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Cooper Northup History of amputation of left front toe 1 month ago. We are not aware of the reason for the amputation as it was done with another clinic. Owner noticed swelling and occasional limping within the past couple days.

SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE FORE PAWS

Canine 3x lateral, 2x DP

BREED RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

American Bulldog Skeletal immaturity, compatible with the given age, is noted.
 P3 and the condyles of P2 of digit 5 are missing; the stump edges are smooth. The stump is surrounded by a soft tissue swelling of approx. 3cm and is most prominent dorsolaterally; the surface of the swelling is slightly undulating.

The swelling may represent an abscess, stump granuloma or a tumor, though the latter is unlikely in such a young dog. Ultrasound is recommended to identify fluid and allow obtaining samples.
