PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

History: Limping on and off on the left front leg. Crepitation around the left elbow during the palpation.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ELBOWS

The muscle mass appears to be symmetrically developed and physiological.

The bones are well mineralized, have a normal trabecular structure and smooth, continuous surfaces. Cortical-medullary development and differentiation of the long bones are physiological.

Elbows: the joints appear congruent with even surfaces.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

I can see no bony abnormalities. Soft tissue injuries (e.g., flexor myositis, plexus neuritis) can only be ruled out with cross sectional imaging, e.g., contrast CT. An intermittent lameness can also be caused by injuries to the paw.
