PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Reason for Visit: check mouth/ ears/cough History: P presents to check mouth, ears, and cough. p also having non productive cough that is now becoming more frequent. o thought it was just due to hairballs at first but states p gets low to ground and moves head side to side while coughing (o has video).

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX

2 orthogonal views

BREED

DSH

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The body condition score is 7/9 with smooth alternating layers of fat and soft tissue opacity.

SEX

The bony structures appear physiological.

NM

The lungs are well inflated, and a gap is present between caudal heart border and diaphragm. Doughnuts and tramlines are present.

AGE

4 Years, 2 Months

The cranial mediastinum is of physiological size and opacity. The trachea diverges from the thoracic vertebrae and the carina is located at T5.

The cardiac silhouette occupies 75% of the chest height and 2 intercostal spaces. No chamber or outflow tract enlargement is evident.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Peri-bronchial infiltrate
- Over-inflation lungs, mild

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The lung pattern indicates bronchitis. Primary inflammatory, non-infectious causes (e.g. neutrophilic, eosinophilic, allergic), as well as infectious causes (bacterial, viral, parasitic) need to be considered. Bronchoscopy including BAL is necessary for a definitive diagnosis.
