PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

In June 4, 2022, there was swelling on the right eye and cheek. Medication was given but did not respond to it. Has history of glaucoma.

SPECIES

Canine

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: IOP OS: 25 IOP OD: 25 Swelling of the right eyelid and the right cheek.

BREED

Labrador Retriever

RADIOGRAPH OF THE HEAD

VD, 6x R lateral and lateral oblique, 2x L lateral, 2x rostro-caudal

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

A mild soft tissue swelling outlines the lateral aspect of the right zygomatic arch. The soft tissues medial to the R zygoma appear more opaque than on the other side.

SEX

Neutered Male

The bones are well mineralized with good trabecular structure and smooth, surfaces.

Both bullae and TMJs, as well as the tooth roots appear physiological.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Soft tissue swelling R zygoma

AGE

8 Years

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The swelling could be the result of hemorrhage, infection, edema, or tumor. Further imaging is necessary to differentiate these diseases and to help identify an abscess due to e.g. foreign body (which may have found entry via the mouth). Apart from contrast cross sectional imaging, ultrasound of the eye can help identify if a retrobulbar mass is present. A re-check of the eye by an ophthalmologist is also advised.
