



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Tucker Carter History: Weight bearing lameness right front paw since the beginning of June, reactive to palpation of P3 5th digit. Minimal improvement on carprofen. Patient is a diabetic.

SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE PAWS

Canine **Right Digit 5**

Soft tissue swelling surrounds the distal interphalangeal joint.

BREED The unguicular crest is difficult to see but the extension of P3 into the horn of the claw is absent.

Schnauzer **RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS**

Digit 5 on right

SEX

Neutered Male

- Bone resorption
- Soft tissue swelling

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

AGE Differential diagnoses for bone resorption include tumor and infection (e.g. fungal). Obtaining a sample from the joint will be necessary for a definitive diagnosis. However, amputation of the digit with histopathological assessment may be more successful for the long term.
