



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Charlie Adams History: 1 days history vomiting , diarrhea , inappetence
 Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: low HCT and RBC, HGB AT LOW NORMAL WBCS ELEVATED

SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Canine Skeletal immaturity compatible with given age is noted as well as an age-related reduction of serosal detail in the abdominal cavity. Diaphragm and abdominal wall are intact.

The liver is located within the costal arch and the caudo-ventral lobe is pointed.

BREED

Border Collie Mix The spleen appears physiological.

SEX

Male

The stomach contains multiple, pebble like, mineral structures (gravel sign) which are also present in duodenum and a more caudally located small intestinal loop; distribution and size of the small intestine (SI) appears physiological. Colon and rectum appear physiological.

Both renal shadows appear of physiological size and opacity. The bladder is small.

AGE

12 Weeks

The sublumbar region appears physiological.

- Pebble like foreign material in stomach and SI

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The intake of foreign material may be primary, due to appetite or inquisitiveness, or secondary to gastritis/gastro-enteritis. Whatever the reason, it can cause obstruction and thus follow up radiographs should be obtained to assess progress of the mineral structures into and, if necessary, through the intestinal tract. Should they persist within the gastric lumen, assessment of the gastro-duodenal junction/pyloric outflow, is necessary either ultrasonographical or endoscopically. I.v. fluid will help prevent/correct dehydration and a higher volume can be used to help move the foreign objects along the intestinal tract.



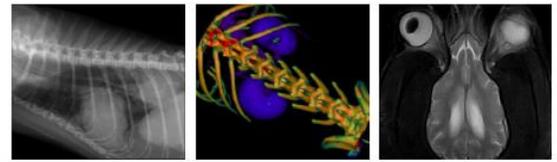
