PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

History: Approximately 4 day history of RF lameness, no apparent inciting cause, does roughhouse with larger housemate

SPECIES

Canine

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Marked RF lameness. no palpable swelling or other abnormalities. Stoic dog, but no pain elicited on firm palpation. ROM WNL in all joints.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ELBOWS

Skeletal immaturity compatible with the given age is noted. The bones are well mineralized, have a normal trabecular structure and smooth, continuous surfaces. Cortical-medullary development and differentiation of the long bones are physiological.

BREED

French Bulldog

The elbow joints are congruent with smooth bone surfaces. Soft tissue swelling is not apparent. The anconeal processes are united and the medial coronoid processes are pointed.

SEX

Female

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- I can see no abnormalities in the elbow joints

AGE

5 Months

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Clinical signs and radiographs suggest a soft tissue injury. Should the symptoms not respond to conservative treatment, clinical examination and radiographs may have to be repeated. A hairline fissure will need at least 10 days of osteoclastic activity to show radiographically.
