**PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS**

Vomiting pieces of rubber foam mat over last 48 hours. Can't keep water or food down. History of eating rubber foam mats.

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: sever abdominal distension& pain during palpation , also soft structures felt during palpation as well , BW indicated sever neutrophilic leukocytosis , moderate hyperglycemia , elevated ALT ,low creatinine , normal fPL.

Right/left lateral and ventrodorsal views totaling 3 images available for review.

DSH

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

The abdominal cavity is distended.

**SEX**

The abdominal serosal detail appears to be maintained.

Female

Moderate dilation of the stomach with gas is seen.

**AGE**

5 Months

There are two populations of small bowel loop. A long small intestinal segment is dilated with gas. There appears to be soft tissue opaque accumulation within the terminal section of this dilated small bowel segment. A population of nondilated small intestinal loops is seen as well and presumed to represent post stenotic segment of a mechanical obstruction.

**RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS**

- Mechanical small intestinal ileus with two populations of small bowel.

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The radiographic findings are consistent with small intestinal mechanical ileus most likely secondary to foreign material obstruction. Timely surgical exploration is recommended if not performed already. At the time of the radiographic examination, there was no evidence of peritonitis.
