**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE LEFT ELBOW**

Mediolateral and craniocaudal views of the left elbow totaling 2 images available for review.

**BREED**

German Shepherd

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

The left elbow joint presents within normal limits. The medial coronoid process is uniformly opacified and well delineated. The elbow joint is congruent with no evidence of periarticular osteophytes or subchondral bone defects.

The left humerus, radius, and ulna present within normal limits.

**SEX**

Faint mineral opacities are seen cranioproximal to the greater humeral tubercle in the left shoulder.

**AGE**

**RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS**

- Normal radiographic presentation of the left elbow.
- Suspect mineralizing left supraspinatus tendinopathy.

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

No significant changes of the left elbow, left radius and ulna, and left humerus are seen.

The radiographic findings of the left shoulder suggest potential for mineralizing supraspinatus tendinopathy. The clinical significance of supraspinatus tendinopathy is highly variable and clinical significance is typically only present if the supraspinatus tendon causes biceps impingement. Clinical correlation is required in the first place. Should there be evidence of pain and lameness originating from the left shoulder, ultrasound or MRI would be options for further definition here.
