PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Pt has a hx of wound on caudal aspect of bridge of nose. Pt usually just came from groomers after wound, but ruling out fb.

SPECIES

Canine

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE SKULL

Lateral, oblique, and dorsoventral views of the skull totaling 4 images available for review.

BREED

Shih Tzu

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The nasal cavities appear to be regular aerated. No evidence of turbinate destruction, aggressive bone lesions, or foreign material is seen.

SEX

Male

The frontal sinuses, tympanic bullae, and temporomandibular joints present within normal limits as well.

Mild soft tissue swelling appears to be present dorsal to the caudal bridge of the nose.

AGE

2 Years

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Suspect soft tissue injury due to trauma or inflammation on the bridge of the nose.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

No radiographic evidence of foreign material, underlying osseous injury, nasal cavity, or frontal sinus involvement is noted. The radiographic findings support the presence of soft tissue injury or inflammation.
