Jasper Holtby lethargic , inappetence, may have ingested absorbent meat packing pads
Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: elevated ALP only

SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Canine Right lateral and ventrodorsal views totaling 2 images available for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

BREED
Labrador Retriever The patient is obese.

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

SEX
Male The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

AGE
8 Years The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Dr. med. Vet. DipECVDI Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

Enlargement of the prostate is seen without evidence of pelvic canal stenosis.

HOSPITAL NAME
St. Catherine's Animal Hospital The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

There is extensive intestinal aerophagia with mild generalized dilation of the small intestine. The larger diameter loops appear to represent cecum and colon based on their anatomic position and no overt segmental dilation of the small intestine is seen. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material.

REFERRING VET RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Dr. Boctor
- Small intestinal ileus without definitive evidence of mechanical obstruction.
 - Prostatomegaly - presumably benign prostatic hyperplasia of the non-neutered male.

INVOICE INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

47775 The radiographic findings are more suggestive for functional ileus than for mechanical obstruction. Consider administering supportive care and symptomatic treatment with recheck radiographs in 24 hours or further definition by means of abdominal ultrasound in case of persisting or deteriorating clinical signs, especially should the patient start to vomit.
