PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

P presented for evaluation of sudden onset of hindlimb lameness, worse on the left hindlimb. O's were away on vacation and noticed increased difficulty rising and/or limping within the last 24 hours. P is e/d/u/d normally.

SPECIES

Canine

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: - Bilateral hindlimb atrophy - Multiple masses, largest is 12-13 cm suspected lipoma right flank - Grade II-III/IV lameness of the hindlimbs, no proprioceptive deficits, lameness is worse on the left hindlimb. - No palpable changes to the hindlimbs appreciated

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN, PELVIS, & STIFLE

2 mediolateral views of the stifles both labeled "left" stifle, ventrodorsal views of the pelvis, and lateral and ventrodorsal views of the abdomen totaling 7 images available for review.

SEX

Female Spayed

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Stifle

The radiographic presentation of the stifle joint is within normal limits. No evidence of articular swelling, osteoarthritis, cranial thrust of the tibia, aggressive bone lesions, or traumatic osseous injury is seen.

AGE

11.7 Years

Pelvis

The coxofemoral joints present within age related normal limits.

The pelvic bones are bilaterally symmetric without evidence of deviation from their expected anatomy.

A large fat opaque subcutaneous mass is seen in the right flank.

A second fat opaque subcutaneous mass appears to be present in the proximal right thigh.

Abdomen

There are moderate spondyloses between T13/L1, L2/3, L3/4, L4/5, and L6/7.

The radiographic presentation of the kidneys and urinary bladder is within normal limits.

The liver and spleen present within normal limits.

Mild gastric aerophagia is seen.

The small and large intestine present within normal limits.

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RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Radiographically normal abdomen.
- Multiple spondyloses within the lumbar spine.
- Lipoma in the right flank.
- Potential lipoma in the proximal right thigh.
- Radiographically normal stifle and coxofemoral joints.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

No evidence of articular pathology is seen in the (left?) stifle joint and coxofemoral joints. The presence of multiple spondyloses may be associated with chronic degenerative disc disease. Owing to the negative findings in the stifle and coxofemoral joints, neurological disease should be considered in this patient next to soft tissue pathology.
