PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Intermittent lameness and muscular atrophy of left hind limb.

SPECIES

Canine

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE LEFT STIFLE & PELVIS

Mediolateral view of the left stifle and ventrodorsal view of the pelvis totaling 2 images available for review.

BREED

Great Pyrenees

Left Stifle

Moderate articular swelling of the left stifle joint is seen. There is cranial thrust of the tibia with respect to the femoral condyles. A mild amount of periarticular osteophytes is present accentuating the distal pole of the patella, femoral trochlea, and cranial margin of the tibial plateau.

SEX

Female Intact

Atrophy of the left hind limb musculature is noted.

AGE

8

Pelvis

Both coxofemoral joints present within normal limits. There is no evidence of osteoarthritic changes, subluxation, dysplasia, or traumatic osseous injury. No evidence of aggressive bone lesions is noted.

- Mild to moderate left stifle osteoarthritis with radiographic evidence of cranial cruciate ligament failure.

The radiographic findings are compatible with left stifle osteoarthritis with cranial cruciate ligament failure. Consider surgical intervention in order to address the presumed biomechanical instability and prevent further damage to the articular structures.
