RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Abdomen

Female

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

AGE

5 Months

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

A mild amount of food is present within the stomach.

The small intestinal loops are nondilated and evenly distributed throughout the mid abdomen. No radiopaque foreign material is seen. There is no evidence of plication.

The radiographic study reveals no evidence of mechanical ileus. No radiopaque foreign material is seen at this point. However, owing to the history, narrow clinical monitoring is advised and abdominal ultrasound as well as full internal medicine workup could be considered for further definition should the patient's clinical signs persist.
