**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN**

Canine

Right lateral and ventrodorsal views totaling 2 images available for review.

**BREED**

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

Dachshund Mix

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

**SEX**

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

Male

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

**AGE**

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

7 Months

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

A moderate amount of gas is seen within the gastric fundus. There is a short linear metal opacity seen within the gastric fundus on both orthogonal views.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

**RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS**

- Small metal opaque foreign body within the stomach.
- Gastric aerophagia- otherwise, radiographically normal abdomen.

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

**INVOICE**

The foreign material within the stomach is small and should be able to pass the gastrointestinal tract unless attached to linear foreign material which does not appear to be likely based on the radiographic findings.

Further definition by means of abdominal ultrasound could be considered in case of gastrointestinal signs.
