RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Canine

Right lateral and ventrodorsal views totaling 3 images available for review.

BREED

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Dachshund Mix

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

SEX

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

Male

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

AGE

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

7 Months

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach contains a mild amount of granulated soft tissue opaque material compatible with food. No evidence of radiopaque foreign material is seen within the stomach or throughout the remainder of the gastrointestinal tract.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits. There is no evidence of mechanical ileus in terms of intestinal dilation and no intestinal plication is seen.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.
