RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX & ABDOMEN

BREED

Labrador Retriever

Right lateral and ventrodorsal views of both thorax and abdomen totaling 4 images available for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

SEX

Male

Thorax

A moderate generalized bronchial lung pattern with even distribution is noted throughout the lung.

AGE

6 Months

Course and width of the trachea are considered within normal limits.

A small thymic remnant is seen which is a normal finding.

Abdomen

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

HOSPITAL NAME

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

REFERRING VET

Dr. Lentis

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

INVOICE

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The stomach is post-prandial. Multiple edgy mineral opacities compatible with small stones are seen within the stomach. The largest are 2.0 cm in size. Smaller mineral opaque structures have passed the stomach already and are seen within the small intestine. There is no evidence of abnormal small intestinal dilation at this point.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Diffuse bronchial lung pattern.
- Gastrointestinal foreign material without evidence of complete mechanical ileus.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic study suggests presence of lower airway disease such as infectious bronchitis/tracheobronchitis versus allergic bronchopneumopathy. Consider a clinical trial of empirical management for infectious bronchitis versus further definition by means of airway endoscopy with airway sampling.

At this time, there is no evidence of mechanical ileus. Recheck radiographs should be obtained at any time vomiting occurs. Based on the size of the ingested stones, they may be able to pass the natural way.
