**ULTRASONOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

**Left Stifle**

A moderate amount of effusion is seen in the infrapatellar recess. Mild heterogeneity of the infrapatellar fat pad is noted.

**BREED**

Beagle

The cranial cruciate ligament presents thickened and ill-defined with partially disrupted echoarchitecture. Regional synovial swelling is noted.

**SEX**

**ULTRASONOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS**

- Cranial cruciate ligament injury of the left stifle with synovialitis and effusion.

**AGE**

11 Years

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The ultrasonographic study confirms presence of cranial cruciate ligament pathology in the left stifle. The findings are compatible with partial rupture of the cranial cruciate ligament. Surgical intervention should be considered in order to address the presumed biomechanical instability and prevent further damage to the articular structures such as the menisci and other.

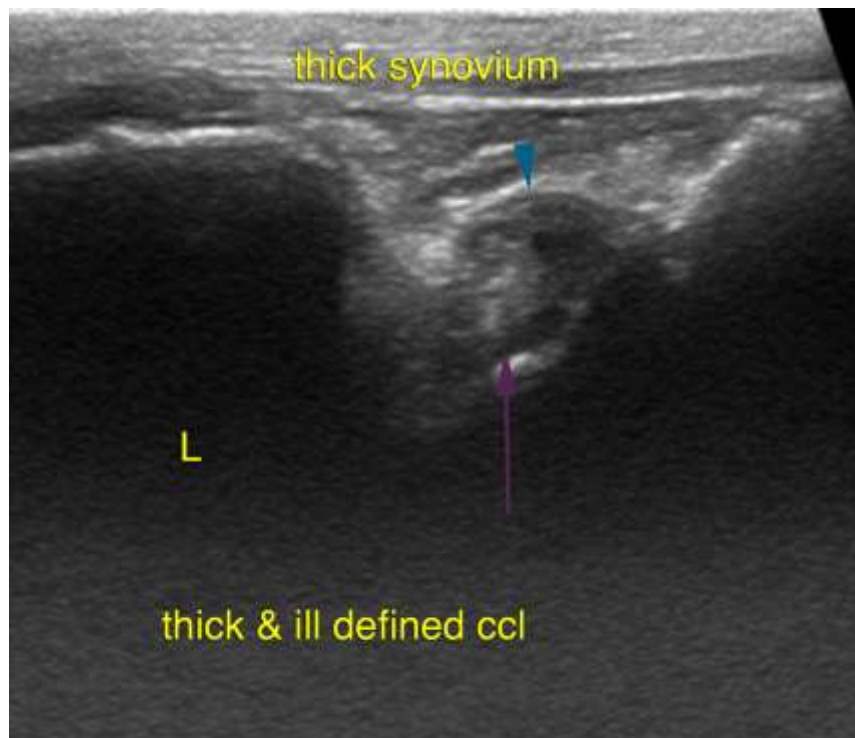
