**PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS**

P presented for evaluation of ongoing intermittent lameness on the left hindlimb. O notes that Gabapentin has not appeared to help the lameness. P goes from completely normal to toe touching lameness.

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Decreased range of motion on flexion and extension of the left hindlimb No appreciable lameness on exam nor pain on palpation

**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE PELVIS****BREED**

Pitbull

2 mediolateral views of the stifles, 1 ventrodorsal hip extended view of the pelvis, and 1 lateral view of the tarsal region available for review.

Requested, however, is the interpretation of the pelvis.

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

The pelvic bones present within normal age related limits. No evidence of traumatic osseous injury is seen. There is no evidence of aggressive bone lesions. The femoral heads are round and well developed. The femoral heads are deeply situated within the acetabular grooves. The dorsal acetabular rim is lateral of the femoral head center which is as expected.

The muscle volume of both hind limbs appears to be symmetric and adequate.

The radiographic presentation of the pelvis is within age related normal limits. No evidence of dysplasia, osteoarthritis, or aggressive bone lesions is seen.
