Reason for Visit: Exam UTI History: 11 y/o sf shih tzu presents for a for having bloody urine 4 days. O describes urine as thick and bloody containing clumps, and cannot hold it in anymore/ dripping all over the house about 6 times a day. Since then has been drinking less water, O says P appears painful. O says has been giving medications that she obtained here previously.
 Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Hydration: N Mentation: N EENT: Corneal pigment 1/3 of corneal OU, corneal vascularization OU, Moderate scl injection OU Oral Cavity: mm pm Lymph Nodes: N Skin: N CV/Respiratory: panting non-stop, no murmur heard Abd/GI: urinary bladder small, feels thickened Uro/Perineum: N Musculoskeletal: N Neurological: N UA in house Urine culture Ab Rads x 2, sonopath - no bladder stones seen Used US prior to getting urine sample - thickened irregular cranial aspect of urinary bladder and what appears to be a mass on the dorsal wall of cranial 1/3 of bladder. Trigone unremarkable. Showed owner ultrasound images and had her take photos and videos STT: 8 OU Fluoroscein - Neg OU Tonometry

Right lateral and ventrodorsal views of the abdomen totaling 2 images available for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

AGE

11 Years, 2 Months

A right lateral thoracic wall lipoma is seen.

The abdominal serosal detail is maintained.

The urinary bladder is moderately distended.

Small intestinal loops and part of the descending colon superimpose onto the cranial half of the urinary bladder. No other abnormal opacities are seen associated with the urinary bladder.

There is no evidence of sublumbar lymphadenomegaly.

Gastric aerophagia is noted.

The liver, spleen, and intestines present within normal limits.

No renal abnormalities are seen. The assessment of the right kidney is slightly limited owing to superimposition with the gastrointestinal tract.

There is evidence of chronic intervertebral disc disease within the lumbar spine between L3 and L4 as well as L4 and L5.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Moderately distended urinary bladder.
- No evidence of sublumbar lymphadenomegaly.
- Gastric aerophagia – likely related to excitement.
- Chronic intervertebral disc disease L3/4 and L4/5.
- Thoracic wall lipoma.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic study did not reveal evidence of abnormal opacities within the urinary bladder which does not rule out presence of a soft tissue mass nor of other pathology including urinary tract infection and/or nonradiopaque calculi. There was no radiographic evidence of sublumbar lymphadenomegaly and/or structural pathology within the abdomen.
