PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Seen eating a ball. Ate breakfast then vomited it up. Initial xray saw gastric foreign material. Emesis induction. Successful. Some remained. Gastrotomy and gastropexy preformed.

SPECIES

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Multiple lateral and orthogonal views of the abdomen obtained sequentially over a time span of 8 hours are available for review.

BREED

Doberman

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The initial radiographs do show multiple sharply delineated semicircular structures of up to 6 cm length within the stomach. Moderate gastric aerophagia is noted. A mild amount of fluid is present in the stomach as well on the initial radiographs.

SEX

M

There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material within the intestine and no evidence of intestinal ileus is seen.

AGE

5 Months

The recheck radiographs do show reduced number but residual foreign material within the stomach persistently. The number of foreign material pieces is down to three on the last pre-surgical radiographs.

The post-surgical study shows moderate pneumoperitoneum with reduced serosal detail and a small stomach that shows no evidence of residual foreign material.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Gastric foreign material reduced by induced vomiting and removed completely after celiotomy with gastrotomy and gastropexy.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic study shows the consecutive removal of foreign material from the stomach by means of induced vomiting and then later on by means of celiotomy and gastrotomy. The recheck radiographs show no residual radiopaque foreign material within the gastrointestinal tract.
