PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Recheck 5 weeks for radiographic uroliths. Zoey only eats pumpkin and boiled chicken. Was placed on Craninidin at time of radiographic diagnosis. Past 3-4 weeks has lost 2 pounds but has become polyphagic.

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: UA today reveals hematuria, pH 5.0. 9 WBC phf w sl proteinuria. Dec 27 2021 BW reveals AlkP 1,015; typically averaging ~ 500 the past 4 years. cPL of 634 (0-200), typically about 300.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX & ABDOMEN

Right lateral and ventrodorsal views of the thorax and abdomen totaling 4 images available for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

SEX

Female Spayed

Thorax

A small soft tissue opaque nodule is noted in the subcutis of the dorsum level with the mid thoracic spine.

AGE

13 Years

Mild loss of the caudal cardiac waist is noted however there is no evidence of overall cardiomegaly. The vertebral heart score is 9.8.

Course and width of the trachea are considered within normal limits.

The lung presents a mild generalized bronchial pattern.

No evidence of abnormal mediastinal widening is noted.

Abdomen

The abdominal serosal detail is maintained.

The kidneys appear to be rather small in size, however, the organ margins are partially superimposed onto the small intestine which limits their assessment. Multiple mineral opaque calculi of up to 5mm diameter superimpose onto the right and left kidney. No evidence of mineral opacities is seen throughout the pathway of the ureters and urinary bladder. The urinary bladder appears to be empty. There is no evidence of soft tissue swelling.

Mild bilateral stifle osteoarthritis is noted. The patellae appear to be luxated medially.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Bilateral renal calculi
- No evidence of radiopaque calculi within the urinary bladder.
- No evidence of lower urinary tract obstruction.

- Mild bilateral stifle osteoarthritis with suspect medial patella luxation.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Presence of radiopaque calculi is seen associated with both kidneys. The larger calculi are likely to be situated within the renal pelvis. No evidence of hydronephrosis or lower urinary tract obstruction is noted radiographically. However, owing to the history of hematuria, further definition by means of ultrasound and full urinalysis could be considered in order to rule out cystitis, urinary bladder neoplasia, or other lower urinary tract pathology.
