PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Presented for annual exam and grooming under sedation due to aggressive behavior. Able to palpate splenic mass once sedated. Brief US revealed ~4cm cavitated mass of the spleen, remainder of brief scan unremarkable. PE revealed multiple masses including MCT on R lateral thorax. Blood work pending. Sx scheduled for removal of both masses.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX

Right/left lateral and ventrodorsal whole body views totaling 3 images available for review.

Thoracic read requested.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The abdominal volume is large. The thoracic volume is small.

The degree of pulmonary inflation is fair. No evidence of interstitial pulmonary nodules or masses is seen. There is a mild generalized bronchointerstitial lung pattern which is within age related normal limits.

No radiographic evidence of cardiovascular pathology is seen.

Course and width of the trachea are within normal limits. Mild redundancy of the dorsal tracheal ligament of the cervical trachea is noted.

There is no evidence of mediastinal lymphadenomegaly or other mediastinal mass effect.

The prominence of the spleen is consistent with the history of a splenic mass. Interpretation of the abdomen is not included in this report.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Normal age related thorax with no evidence of pulmonary metastatic disease.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic presentation of the lung, bronchial tree, and cardiovascular system is within the expected limits. At this time, there is no radiographic evidence of metastatic disease.
