Kaido has been vomiting since yesterday, las vomited this morning; also may have eaten some chlorine tablets from the pool (small amounts per owner)

**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN**

Right/left lateral and ventrodorsal views totaling 3 images available for review.

**BREED**

Rottweiler

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

**SEX**

MN

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

**AGE**

9 Months

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach contains a mild amount of fluid and gas. No evidence of abnormal dilation or malpositioning is seen. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material within the stomach.

The small intestinal loops are evenly distributed throughout the mid abdomen and mildly turgid in appearance yet there is no evidence of abnormal dilation, plication, or radiopaque foreign material.

The colon contains a mix of gas and inspissated fecal matter. The colon and cecum are seen in their anticipated positions.

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The radiographic study reveals no overt signs of complete mechanical ileus of the small intestine. No radiopaque foreign material is seen. Functional ileus is considered likely based on the radiographic findings. Recheck radiographs or abdominal ultrasound could be considered in case of persisting or recurring clinical signs.
