PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

5 YO FI Frenchie Ingested piece of thick plastic rubber of toy last week. Acute onset hyperexia Does not vomit food but will vomit water Suspect gas in the cecum VS SI Please R/O pyometra

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Right/left lateral and ventrodorsal views of the abdomen totaling 4 images available for review.

BREED

French Bulldog

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Screw-tailed dog with shortened sacrum, lumbosacral transitional vertebra, and multiple block and hemivertebra within the coccygeal spine. T8, T9, and T10 are hemivertebrae as well.

The abdominal serosal detail is maintained.

SEX

Female Intact

No uterine enlargement can be appreciated radiographically.

The colon contains a moderate amount of inspissated fecal matter. The cecum contains a large amount of gas and is seen in its anticipated position to the right of the cranial and mid lumbar spine.

No evidence of small intestinal dilation or radiopaque foreign material is seen.

The urinary bladder is moderate distended.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- No radiographic evidence of uterine enlargement.
- No radiographic evidence of mechanical ileus or radiopaque foreign material.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic study reveals no evidence of radiopaque foreign material or small intestinal obstruction. Paralytic ileus or subileus appear more likely. The presence of nonradiopaque foreign material cannot be ruled out entirely.
