RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE MID & CAUDAL ABDOMEN

Right and left lateral views of the mid and caudal abdomen totaling 2 images available for review.

BREED

Border Collie Mix

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Mild spondylosis deformans is present within the cranial lumbar spine between L1/2 and L2/3 as well as L3/4.

SEX

Female Spayed

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

AGE

8 Years

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

INVOICE

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No structural pathology can be identified within the abdominal cavity. There is no evidence of organomegaly, mass effects, reduced serosal detail, or mineral opaque calculi throughout the urinary tract. Further definition by means of full internal medicine workup and abdominal ultrasound could be considered.
