The abdominal serosal detail is maintained.

AGE
 9 Years
 Mildly reduced delineation of the abdominal organs is seen in the cranial abdomen caudal to the stomach.

The stomach contains a mild amount of gas.

The small intestinal loops are evenly distributed throughout the mid abdomen with no evidence of abnormal dilation, plication, or radiopaque foreign material.

The liver and kidneys present within normal limits.

The urinary bladder is severely distended. No evidence of abnormal opacities of the urinary bladder is seen.

The visible spleen presents within normal limits.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The urinary bladder is severely distended. The possibility of feline lower urinary tract disease should be considered versus conscious withholding of urine due to pain or other illness.

The reduced serosal detail in the cranial abdomen may be due to crowding of abdominal organs. Regional peritonitis or a small amount of effusion cannot be ruled out entirely. Consider full abdominal ultrasound for further definition.
