Inappetence for 3 days

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Single right lateral whole body view available for review. Abdominal read requested.

BREED

French Bulldog

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Mild gastric aerophagia is noted.

The small intestinal loops are evenly distributed throughout the mid abdomen with no evidence of abnormal dilation, plication, or radiopaque foreign material. Mild crowding of the small intestine is seen in the center of the abdomen.

SEX

Male

The colon is empty except for a mild amount of gas.

The splenic tail is mildly prominent.

AGE

2 Years

The liver and kidneys present within normal limits.

Note the presence of a wedge shaped hemivertebra in the caudal lumbar spine at L7 with mild kyphosis and early spondylosis deformans.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Gastrointestinal maldigestion pattern with no evidence of mechanical ileus.
- Mild splenomegaly.
- Congenital vertebral malformation: hemivertebra L7 with early spondylosis deformans.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic study reveals no definitive underlying cause of the inappetence. There is no evidence of mechanical intestinal ileus. The gastrointestinal tract is largely empty. Gastric aerophagia is noted which may be due to gastropathy or swallowing of air due to stress or pain.

There appears to be potential for mild splenomegaly. Differential diagnosis includes idiopathic hypersplenism, extramedullary hematopoiesis, reactive or other splenitis, and infiltrative disease.

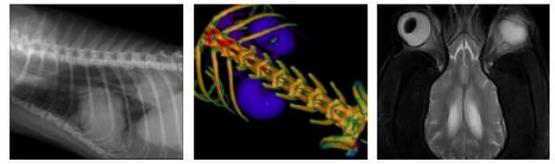
