PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

o noted p seemed stuffy and started sneezing 2-3 days ago. Open mouth breathing yesterday and today. Vomited 5x yesterday - mostly bile, once her kibble. No diarrhea per o. Does not think got into anything.

SPECIES

Feline

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Pending bw results. Open mouth breathing, panting, temp 104, no murmur noted, lungs clear. obese. significant dental tartar.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX & ABDOMEN

BREED

DSH

Right/left lateral and ventrodorsal whole body views totaling 4 images available for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The patient is obese

SEX

Female Spayed

Thorax

The visible lung presents a moderate generalized bronchial pattern.

AGE

14 Years

There is no radiographic evidence of cardiovascular pathology.

The visible trachea presents normal course and width.

Abdomen

The liver is of normal size. A rounded faintly mineral opaque structure is superimposed onto the liver and may be compatible with the gallbladder.

The stomach contains a moderate amount of fluid and a mild amount of gas.

The small intestinal loops are evenly distributed throughout the mid abdomen. No evidence of abnormal plication or radiopaque foreign material is seen. Mild generalized dilation of the small intestine appears to be present.

The colon contains a mild amount of fecal matter.

Mineral opacities are superimposed onto the kidneys and between the descending colon and urinary bladder.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Suspect distended gallbladder.
- Fluid filled stomach.
- Functional ileus.
- Suspect hypercalcemic nephropathy.
- Suture granulomas dorsal to the gallbladder from prior spay versus bates bodies versus ureteral calculi.
- Bronchial lung pattern.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The stomach is mildly fluid distended. Impaired gastric emptying should be considered a potential. Functional ileus appears more likely based on the radiographic findings than mechanical obstruction.

SPECIES

Feline

The findings furthermore suggest potential for a distended gallbladder. Triaditis would be a potential explanation for the radiographic findings in a feline patient, however, further definition does require correlation with the laboratory values and may require full abdominal ultrasound.

BREED

DSH


The bronchial lung pattern may be within age related normal limits. Lower airway disease such as recurrent allergic lower airway syndrome or infectious bronchitis including viral, bacterial, parasitic, and protozoal cannot be ruled out entirely. Correlate with the clinical findings.

SEX
