PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

1 week history of running around the house ok but then holding his LF paw up while sitting. Seems to be jumping less but eating/acting ok otherwise. Had laser therapy on elbows and paws and that did seem to help a bit.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE FRONT PAWS & LEFT ELBOW

Dorsopalmar view of both front paws and mediolateral and craniocaudal views of the left elbow totaling 3 images available for review.

BREED

Maine Coon Cat

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The bones and joints of both front paws present within normal limits.

SEX

A cystic lesion is seen within the medial and distal aspect of the left radiocarpal bone.

AGE

Moderate osteoarthritic changes of the left elbow are seen as well as an osseous metaplasia within the flexor tendon origin. Deformity, reduced opacity, and irregular outline of the medial coronoid process appear to be present as well as an isolated bony structure medial to the left elbow joint space.

Similar findings appear to be present in the right elbow.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Medial coronoid pathology with moderate secondary osteoarthritis and flexor enthesopathy of the left elbow.
- Suspect bone cyst within the left radiocarpal bone.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic study reveals bilateral signs of osteoarthritis secondary to medial coronoid pathology of the elbows. The changes appear to be more pronounced on the left side and combined with potential chronic flexor enthesopathy.

The cystic structure within the medial and distal aspect of the left radiocarpal bone is likely to represent a bone cyst. Aggressive bone lysis and erosive arthritis are potential differential diagnoses.
