PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Displayed bony structures of spine and thorax are within normal limits without signs of a fracture, sub-/luxation and/or a lytic/sclerotic process. There are mild calcifications of the nuclei at L5/6 and L6/7 recognized. Both hip joints present severe osteoarthritis. There is significant fat storage noted.

The cardiac silhouette is normal with no evidence of chamber enlargement. Pulmonary vessels are normal in size and taper appropriately in the periphery. Lung shows regular density, no evidence of focal/nodular lesions. Trachea is unremarkable in diameter and course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth. The carina and the bronchial tree appear normal. Mediastinum presents expected soft tissue density, there is no evidence of tracheobronchial, cranial mediastinal or sternal lymphadenopathy. No mediastinal shift is seen. Esophagus is not visible and considered to be normal. Diaphragm is unremarkable, no signs of pleural effusion.

Abdomen:

Liver and spleen present as expected and are well defined. Caudal to the spleen an ill-defined area of increased opacity is recognized.

Stomach and intestine are inconspicuous. Large intestine shows some radiopaque ingesta, which is normal.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Calcification of the nuclei may be an indirect sign for discopathy. Compelling evidence of a compressive lesion is not detected. Findings of the hip joints most probably match with the reported clinical symptoms. The mild increased opacity caudal to the spleen may represent the normal pancreas being visible due to excellent fat contrast. Apart from that radiographs show normal findings of the thorax and the abdomen.
