RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Lateral and vd views provided for review.

BREED

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

All displayed bony structures are unremarkable without signs of a fracture, sub-/luxation and/or a lytic/sclerotic process. There is mild degenerative ventral spondylosis in the course of the thoracic spine noted.

SEX

Female

Liver and spleen present as expected and are well defined.

AGE

5 Years

Stomach and small intestine are unremarkable, predominantly empty with some gas filling of the stomach and small intestine. The colon shows distension of all sections with moderate filling with foamy to mottled and radiopaque content.

Both kidneys are not well visualized but considered to be normal.

No signs of abdominal or retroperitoneal effusion.

Urinary bladder is mildly filled, there is no evidence of radiopaque cystic calculi.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Significant filling of the colon with radiopaque feces and generalized enlargement of the colon

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Radiographs present a moderately distended colon which is suspicious for megacolon comparing the transverse colon diameter and the length of the cranial end plate of L2. However, this finding can be influenced by multiple circumstances and may be secondary to other issues. There may be mechanical and/or functional constipation present. A relevant stenosis (for example narrowing of the pelvic diameter) or displacement of the colon is not recognized.
