PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Dorsal flexure of the back noted when the patient walks, the O would like screening interpretation to make sure no underlying orthopedic pathology is noted.

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: All WNL

Canine

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**Pelvis**

The bony structures of the pelvis and the sacroiliac joints are unremarkable. There is no evidence of a lytic process noted. Coxofemoral joints are inconspicuous.

BREED

Doberman

The displayed medullary bone of both femurs present diffuse and patchy increase of the medullary bone. There are not lytic changes of the cortices recognized. Relevant periosteal reactions are missing.

SEX

Male

The stomach contains foreign/structured material.

AGE

6 Months

- Osteomyelitis/panosteitis of both femurs is suspected
- Foreign material stomach

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Both hip joints are inconspicuous.

Radiographic findings of both femurs likely represent an inflammatory process as seen with panosteitis/osteomyelitis. Common differentials are hematogenous infectious disease and bone infarcts after trauma (systemic disease? CRP/hyperthermia? if so, consider antibiotics). Restriction of activity and pain therapy with follow up radiographs (S1/2 and femurs) in two weeks are recommended.
