



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Sam Shedd History: head tilt started 2 days ago. eating normally. no other signs General Appearance: mild left sided head tilt, obese, somewhat fractious BCS: 8/9 MM: pink Eyes: Clear corneas, no conjunctivitis or discharge present, retinal exam normal Oral: No oral masses noted, dental grade: 1 Skin: No parasites noted, no lesions present, normal hydration Ears: No debris, odor, or swelling present AU Heart: Normal heart rate, no arrhythmia present, pulses are synchronized Respiratory: Lung fields sound clear, no nasal discharge present Abdominal Palpation: no pain palpated, no obvious masses present Gastrointestinal: WNL Urogenital: No abnormalities noted Lymph nodes: No enlargement noted Musculoskeletal: No gait deficit or pain palpated during joint manipulation, no muscle atrophy present Neurological: mild left sided head tilt, slight ataxia head tilt, slight ataxia polycythemia with normal hydration obese Chem/Lytes: NSF CBC: increased HCT=62, increased HGB 20.5, increased RBC=18.09 screening blood work bullae rads advise telemed of bullae rads consider internal referral due to polycythemia if telemed ok if owner doesn't pursue referral then follow clinical signs and CBC

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE HEAD

AGE

11 Years 10 Months

Both tympanic bullae appear completely ventilated with an inconspicuous bulla wall. The horizontal sections of both external ear canals are mildly narrowed but ventilated. Signs of a lytic or sclerotic process are not recognized.

Bony structures of the skull and nasal cavities present normal findings.

There is no overt evidence of an inflammatory or even neoplastic process recognized. Ventilation of the tympanic bulla and the external ear canals does not fully exclude otitis media/externa.
