PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Reason for Visit: COUGHING History: 3y 8m old SF DSH presents for coughing for months, O says typically every day - nonproductive. No hairballs. Nothing's changed in home, no smokers, indoor only

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX

Radiographs of the thorax in two orthogonal imaging planes.

BREED

DSH

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

The extrathoracic soft tissues present homogeneous without abnormalities.

SEX

SF

The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement. The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

AGE

3 Years, 8 Months

Multifocal mild peribronchial cuffing is seen.

The lung parenchyma presents the expected architecture and opacity; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

The diaphragm is well delineated with even surface and the expected mild cranial bulging of the diaphragmatic cupola.
