**SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN**

Canine  
 Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

**BREED**

Chihuahua

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

**SEX**

Female Spayed

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space. A small nodular radiopaque structure is seen in the retroperitoneal space ventral to L5 – considered as the a. circumflexa ilium profunda.

**AGE**

2 Years

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and contains foamy material.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The radiographic study of the abdomen presents without specific abnormalities. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. If not done so yet, complementing workup by cpl appears beneficia. If clinical signs are refractory to therapy, recommend follow up radiographs or a complete abdominal ultrasound examination.
