PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Bentley Montgomery

Bentley has a lump on his right flank, occasionally vomiting, behavior change. Christmas Eve he snapped at the other dogs and this is very unusual for him. He does appear to be nauseated and does vomit. He usually vomits food and lots of stomach acid; there have been no food changes and Bentley throws up once a day to once every other day. He doesn't appear to be sensitive to abdominal pressure. The lump on the flank was pointed out in the room, and Lee wasn't sure if it was possible weight gain.

Radiographs of the abdomen in orthogonal imaging planes are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

SEX

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

MN

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

AGE

9 Years

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.
