



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Vito De Simone Presented with runny nose and coughing with nasal bloody discharge . O says had a fever Jan 3rd and nose has been runny since then. Bloody nasal discharge started this morning (Jan 8th). Otherwise E/D, BAR, BM normal. vomited once yesterday (Jan 7)
SPECIES Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Temp was normal .

Canine **RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX**

A complete set of radiographs of the thorax is provided for review.

BREED RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Boxer The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits; the growth plates are age related open.

SEX The extrathoracic soft tissues present homogeneous without abnormalities.

Male The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement. The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

AGE The cranial mediastinum presents the expected soft tissue opacity. The mediastinal width is less than twice the width of the vertebral column at the same level.

8 Months The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

Sebastian Schaub, DVM Dr. med. vet. DipECVDI The bronchial tree presents with thin walls and tapers uniformly towards the periphery as expected.

HOSPITAL NAME

The lung parenchyma presents the expected architecture and opacity; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

Truscott Animal Hospital The diaphragm is well delineated with even surface and the expected mild cranial bulging of the diaphragmatic cupola.

INVOICE

The current radiographic study is negative for pathology. However, normal radiographs do not rule out possible lower airway infection – such as viral disease (e.g. kennel cough). As radiographic changes lack behind clinical signs, follow up radiographs should be considered if clinical signs deteriorate and/or refractory to therapy.
