Swelling on middle toe right front foot, very painful, non-weight bearing

**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE FRONT PAWS**

Radiographs of the right front paw in a mediolateral and dorsopalmar projection are provided for review. Radiographs are provided in JPEG file formation; multiple compression artefacts are present.

**BREED**

Roweiller Mix

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

The fourth digit of the right front paw presents a moderate to marked circumferential soft tissue swelling. The distal phalanx of the fourth digit presents permeative osteolytic lesions.

**SEX**

The remainder of the osseous and soft tissue structures of the right front paw are within normal limits.

No abnormalities of the left front paw are appreciated.

- Soft tissue swelling fourth digit right front paw
- Monostotic aggressive osteolytic lesion distal phalanx fourth digit right front paw

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The findings are compatible with either chronic onychitis with osteitis or neoplastic transformation such as squamous cell carcinoma or melanoma. Amputation of the affected digit is the therapy of choice in both cases.
