PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

History: Appetite decreased by 70-80% x 4 weeks. Patient has always vomited twice a week for life. Normal bowel movements. Spirits are down. Urinating normally.

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Bloods pending.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.

BREED

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The body condition score is 8/9.

SEX

Neutered Male

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

AGE

7 Years

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The current radiographic study of the abdomen presents without clinically relevant pathology explaining the described clinical signs. Complementing blood work by fpl appears beneficial as well. An abdominal ultrasound examination can be used to screen for mural changes of the intestinal tract – such as IBD or round cell neoplasia – or signs of pancreatitis, hepatitis, etc.
