


PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Zander Grilly P presented for a 1.5-month duration of intermittent vomiting. O was previously seen in Sept 2021 and all findings were WNL. O notes that P did well for a while, but then vomiting began again. Vomit is both bilious and also digested food. Vomiting does not occur daily.

SPECIES Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: BW pending Moderate pain response on palpation of the cranial abdomen

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN
BREED

Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.

Miniature Schnauzer

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

SEX

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

Neutered Male

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

AGE

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

8.4 Years

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

The radiographic study of the abdomen presents without abnormalities. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. Results of blood work are pending and should include CPL to check for underlying pancreatitis. Rule out dietary changes/food intolerance as source for the clinical signs as well. If clinical signs are refractory to empirical therapy, an abdominal ultrasound examination can be considered as advanced imaging modality.
