PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

vomiting blood started 3-4 days ago, not eating and lethargic
Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: highly elevated cpli, rest is unremarkable

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

A lateral view of the abdomen is provided for review.

BREED

Yorkshire Terrier

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

SEX

Female

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

AGE

11 Months

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and empty.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and contains a mild amount of unformed fecal material and is otherwise empty.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The empty gastrointestinal tract is a sequela to the clinical signs. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. Given the changes of the lab work the presumptive diagnosis is pancreatitis.
