**PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS**

Was limping for a few days, then jumped out of a car (not moving, parked) and since then has been limping on the LF badly. Original radiographs taken October 5th and no obvious issues noted, treated with Metacam but still very lame. Seems painful near elbow/shoulder on left forelimb. Additional radiographs taken today November 7th of shoulder.  
Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Normal CBC/biochem/Accuplex.

**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE FRONT LIMBS**

Radiographs of the front limbs are provided for review.

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

Both shoulder joints present smooth osseous margins and the surrounding soft tissue structures are within normal limits.

The elbow joints bilaterally present smooth osseous margins, the contour of the medial coronoid process is well-defined, and the density is homogeneous. The soft tissue structures surrounding the elbow joints are unremarkable.

The carpal joints present without abnormalities of the osseous and surrounding soft tissue structures.

The osseous and soft tissue structures of the front paws are within normal limits.

**RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS**

- Normal shoulder joints
- Normal elbow joints
- Normal carpi and front paws

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The radiographic study of the front limbs presents without abnormalities, explaining the front limb lameness. Rule out lameness originating from the soft tissue structures or cervical spine. Ultrasound can be used for evaluation of the bicipital tendon and rotator cuff.
