PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

swelling on left side of face with prolapsed third eyelid with mild swelling on left upper lip. Need to rule out and neoplasia and any anatomical abnormality.

Radiographs of the skull in multiple imaging planes are provided for review.

BREED

Domestic Shorthair

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The left ocular bulb is in a mild rostral position relative to the right ocular bulb and a mild soft tissue swelling is appreciated along the left lips.

SEX

Neutered Male

The osseous structures of the skull present no abnormalities.

The nasal cavity is aerated and presents with the expected striated pattern of the nasal conchal & turbinate structures.

The external ear canals are aerated.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

An underlying cause for the clinically and radiographically appreciated swelling is not appreciated and both an inflammatory origin (e.g. dental disease, abscess) or underlying neoplastic disease are still considerations here. Depending on the development of clinical signs and potential abnormalities of blood work (e.g. inflammatory changes), cross-sectional imaging might be considered as advanced imaging modality.
